Zenith was the inventor of subscription television and the modem remote control, and was the first to develop high-definition television (HDTV) in North America. Zenith became known for its high-quality radios and electronic innovations. The first Zenith television set appeared in 1939, with its first commercial sets sold to the public in 1948.

The company is credited with having invented such things as the wireless remote control and FM multiplex stereo. They were known as the leading electronic pioneers in the United States. You had the top of the line if you owned a Zenith electronic product.

They prided themselves for putting out quality products. Before they put their name on it they put their quality in it. Isn't that how it is for us? It is just time used to take a break from the everyday routine and responsibilities of daily living. Jesus saw and spoke the need to the disciples. We should take heed to that same advice!




NO MAGIC SOLUTION...
